Is the state effectively containing the novel coronavirus ("COVID-19")? Data current as of July 6, 2020

# **STATUS: RED**


COVID Exit Strategy (<u>www.covidexitstrategy.org</u>), a nonpartisan group of public health and crisis experts, has been tracking the progress states have made towards meeting the CDC recommended benchmarks states should reach before reopening their economies. On July 6<sup>th</sup>, 2020, only three states were meeting these metrics, earning a "Green" rating.



Currently, Illinois is meeting half of the benchmarks, and is rated "Red" by COVID Exit Strategy due to a 2week trend of rising case numbers and rising test positivity over the same time period.

## CDC Benchmark: a 14-day decline in influenza-like illness

The CDC recommends that states report a 14-day decline in influenza-like illness ("ILI") before lifting restrictions. Illinois **HAS MET** this benchmark. ILI numbers for outpatient and Emergency Room ("ER") visits are reported to the CDC weekly. Illinois reported a decrease in ILI from 373 to 250 between the week ending June 20<sup>th</sup> and the week ending July 4<sup>th</sup>.

#### **CDC Benchmark: declining COVID+**


The CDC recommends a state show a 14-day decline in documented cases of COVID-19 before reopening. Illinois has **NOT MET** this benchmark. Daily COVID+ cases in Illinois increased 29% over the last 14 days.


#### **CDC Benchmark: testing**

The CDC recommends a state show a downward trajectory for the percentage of COVID-19 tests that are positive before reopening. Illinois has **NOT MET** this benchmark. Average test positivity has been flat in the state over the last 14 days.


#### **CDC Benchmark: hospital capacity**

The CDC recommends a state have sufficient hospital capacity to treat all patients without crisis care (20% capacity available over last 7 days). Illinois **HAS MET** this benchmark. The highest reported occupancy in the last week was 62% for inpatient beds and 54% for ICU beds. Hospitalizations are trending down. Illinois - Last 60 days of new COVID+ Cases with 7-day Trend

### Recommendations

Illinois is currently meeting 2 out of 4 the CDC benchmarks that Illinois PIRG has been tracking, but the recent increases in cases have been small so far. However, recent outbreaks in other states have shown that the virus can resurge at any time if businesses or consumers do not follow social distancing recommendations and other public health guidelines, such as wearing a mask in public spaces. Failure to do so could lead to new outbreaks, or even require a second lockdown.
