To Whom It May Concern,

We are writing to inform you of the San Jacinto County Farm Bureau's opposition to the Peach Creek Environmental Park Landfill located at the physical location of: intersection of FM 1725 & Fostoria Tram Rd S 1.9 mi on Fostoria Tram Rd. W approximately 0.7 mi to Rajack Rd. N 0.3 mi to Facility Entrance Rd.

The proposed landfill would be detrimental to the health and livelihood of residents and farms in our neighboring community. The location of the proposed landfill is within 100 feet of a flood plain and is in proximity to working family farms and is to border the Sam Houston National forest.

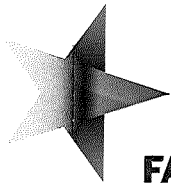

A RESOLUTION OF THE SAN JACINTO COUNTY FARM BUREAU, SAN JACINTO COUNTY, TEXAS OPPOSING AN APPLICATION FOR LAND USE FOR SOLID WASTE PERMIT FROM THE PEACH CREEK COMPANY TO THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY.

WHEREAS, the Peach Creek Company (formally named PC-II, LLC, and herein after called the "Company") out of Ridgeland, Madison County, Mississippi, filed an application with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("TCEQ") for a Land Use Compatibility Determination for a Municipal Solid Waste Permit (Proposed Permit No. 2406) on August 28, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Municipal Solid Waste Type I Landfill would be called the Peach Creek Environmental Park ("Landfill") and would be located in the southern part of San Jacinto County; and

WHEREAS, the San Jacinto County Farm Bureau Board of Directors has serious concerns about the health, safety and welfare implications to its members, neighboring farms, residents, and residents in the surrounding area, due to the inevitability that such a Landfill will contaminate the soil on and near the proposed Landfill, as well as pollute nearby streams, tributaries and bayous; and

WHEREAS, the San Jacinto County Farm Bureau Board of Directors recognizes that such contamination and pollution significantly impacts the overall wellness of local family farms, and residents in the surrounding area; and

WHEREAS, the San Jacinto County Farm Bureau Board of Directors has serious concerns about the flaring of methane gas and the immediate proximity to the Sam Houston National Forest creating forest fire concerns; and

WHEREAS, the San Jacinto County Farm Bureau Board of Directors has serious concerns about potential ground water wells and surface water contamination impacting nearby residents, farms, livestock and irrigation water sources; and

WHEREAS, the San Jacinto County Farm Bureau Board of Directors has serious concerns about farm revenue declines from consumer safety fears of food being produced directly adjacent to a Landfill; and

WHEREAS, the San Jacinto County Farm Bureau Board of Directors has serious concerns about forage/hay and farm produce being economically unharvestable due to Landfill trash littered within production fields; and

WHEREAS, the San Jacinto County Farm Bureau Board of Directors has serious concerns about unavoidable damage to defecated produce crops and infant livestock due to Landfill seagull infestations; and

WHEREAS, for the above-mentioned reasons, the San Jacinto County Farm Bureau Board of Directors is strongly opposed to permitting the Company to construct the Landfill.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the San Jacinto County Farm Bureau Board of Directors:

Expresses its strong opposition to any approval by TCEQ of the Application for Land Use Compatibility Determination for a Municipal Solid Waste Permit No. 2406.
